

CORPORATE/ PROJECT MEMBERSHIP

Work sites and projects are often in remote and difficult regions, far from transport hubs and high-quality medical infrastructure. To help maintain the health of your workforce and ensure operational continuity, these locations may need specific medical support and customized evacuation plans.

SkyAid understands these unique geographic and operational environments with project membership. We can arrange medical evacuation, advice and provide a seamless link from the work site to our alarm center.

Project membership is applicable to everyone working on site—from expatriate and assignees to local nationals and contractors. SkyAid members are able to receive medical assistance and can benefit from a customized medical evacuation plan developed specifically for your operating environment.



Corporate/Project membership also includes:

HELICOPTER LANDING ZONE REQUIREMENTS

A secure landing zone will be established at the scene. Ideally this should be accompanied by an engine company but other public safety members may assist. A charge hose line is not required.

Landing zones should be large enough for the helicopter to safely land and take off. While minimum size is 100 ft x 100 ft (daytime) larger areas that allow longer take off runs are ideal. Consider the need for helicopters to take off into the wind whenever possible. Approach and departure paths should be free of obstructions (wires, poles, antenna, trees, etc). Landing zone should be marked with lights, vehicle headlights and a big letter H or cones as feasible. Use of flares is prohibited. Spotlights and high beams should not be pointed toward the aircraft.

EXCLUSIONS

- A Member with mild lesions, simple injuries such as sprains, simple fractures or mild illness which can be treated by a local doctor and do not prevent the member from continuing his or her trip or returning home.
- Has a primary admitting diagnosis of a psychiatric disorder.
- Is medically discharged or leaves the hospital/clinic against medical advice and is able to travel on their own.
- Is travelling following a terminal prognosis.
- No mortal remains transportation.
- Women beyond their second trimester of pregnancy.

AIRGURUS - SKY AID AIR AMBULANCE MEMBERSHIP

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BENEFITS OF MEMBERSHIP

SkyAid Membership is a subscription-based program that provides prepaid protection against all Medivac transport cost. SkyAid ambulance membership offers several benefits.

- Two (2) emergency air transports per year at no cost.
- Maximum of twenty thousand pesos (P20,000) of emergency medical assistance fund.
- Access to SkyAid air ambulance service 24/7/365 from any point of the Philippines.
- And becoming a SkyAid member is a good way to support the health care needs of rural communities in the Philippines through our outreach program.

ELIGIBILITY

- Anyone under the age of 70 may apply for membership
- Membership is valid only if the applicable membership down payment is collected.
- Family membership shall include the named primary member, his or her spouse and up to two of their children (including step, foster or legally adopted children) under the age of 18.
- Due to aircraft weight and size, members must weigh less than 300 pounds.

WHEN WE WILL TRANSPORT YOU

- Extensive or urgent medical attention is needed and time critical, when illness or injury requires treatment by a specialist and/or use of the facilities of another hospital within 24 hours.
- Confirmation from an attending physician that declares patient is stable for medivac.
- You must have confirmed admission at the receiving hospital prior to transport.

- Critical illness or injury where patient cannot be transported by commercial means.
- Both the originating and receiving hospitals/clinics must be reasonably accessible by ground ambulance to transport the member to and from an airfield/helipad capable of accommodating the medical aircraft we provide.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITION

- SkyAid Air Ambulance is not an insurance. We must make all the arrangements for air medical transport services.
- SkyAid Member is eligible to receive an emergency medical assistance fund to help cover the bill at the receiving hospital that may exceed any insurance or medical benefits.
- Decisions regarding urgency of the case, the best timing, and most suitable means of transportation will be made by the SkyAid Air Ambulance medical director after consultation with the attending physician and member's receiving physician.
- SkyAid members are entitled to two (2) transports per year provided that they do not occur within the same 30 day period.
- Remote evacuation to the closest medical facility will constitute one member transport with regard to the allowable transport per year. Continued transfer to another hospital will not be covered.
- Transportation from remote areas or islands to a location with an airfield/helipad/landing site accessible to medical aircraft is not provided. Costs of evacuation from these remote areas are the responsibility of the member.
- Due to limited medical and laboratory facilities on cruise ships/yachts, in some cases our medical director may require a member to be admitted to a hospital on-shore before scheduling air medical transportation to another hospital.
- The patient and an accompanying passenger are limited to one small carry-on bag each due to limited space available on medical aircraft. We will assist in arranging for additional luggage to be forwarded at the member's expense.
- If member's condition permits, he or she may be transported as a patient on a scheduled commercial airline in the care of a medical team.
- Family members, business associates, and/or travelling companions accompanying patients transported as a patient on a scheduled commercial airline are responsible for their own airfare.
- One family member, business associate, and/or travelling companion may accompany the patient, at no additional cost, on the medical aircraft if space is available and the patient's care is not compromised.

- Intentional or unintentional errors or omissions in information provided to SkyAid may result in the refusal of services and/or cancellation of the membership.
- Membership enrolments and renewals are non-transferable, non-refundable and subject to approval by SkyAid Air Ambulance.



- Members will not be entitled to air medical transport benefits if their illness or injury is the result of or is contributed to by the following:
 - a) War, invasion, or civil war.
 - b) Attempted suicide or intentional self-injury.
 - c) Alcohol or drug abuse.
 - d) A member's own criminal / felonious act, or sustained while the member is in a state of insanity.
 - e) A member with an infectious disease or suffering from tuberculosis or other chronic airborne pathogens at the time of enrolment will not be transported for any condition related to that infection.
 - f) A member on an organ transplant list prior to enrolment will not be entitled to a transport for that transplant.
- Airgurus' SkyAid reserves the right to change or amend these rules and regulations without notice to members.
- The interpretation and application of the rules and regulations communicated in this publication, as well as any subsequent changes or amendments, are within the sole discretion of SkyAid-Air Ambulance management.
- All determinations by SkyAid Air Ambulance shall be final and conclusive in each case.
